Garbage Collection Regulations

Garbage Container Guidelines (Sanitation Code 485)

- **Size and Weight Limits:**
 - Garbage containers must be **32 gallons or smaller** and **weigh no more than 70 pounds**.
 - You can also use a **32-gallon garbage bag** that is strong enough to hold waste. However, please note that the City of Peekskill is not responsible for any broken containers or bags.
- **Container Requirements:**
 - Containers should be **watertight** and have a **tight-fitting lid**. You can find standard-sized garbage containers at local stores for a reasonable price.

Collection Limits:

- Each residence or business can have a maximum of **four 32-gallon garbage containers** per property parcel collected per week.
- If you have more than four containers, an overflow program is available. You can also buy official City of Peekskill garbage bags at City Hall for **\$10 each**.

Container Pick Up:

- Multi-family buildings that use **1.5 cubic yard containers** must pay a fee of **\$30 per container** for each collection.
- Businesses using **1.5 cubic yard containers** must pay **\$35 per container** for each collection.

Collection Times:

- Place garbage, trash, and recycling at the curb after **6 PM the night before collection** and no later than **6:30 AM** on the day of collection.

Preparing Garbage:

- Garbage should be normal household waste, drained and wrapped in bags before putting it in the container.

BULK TRASH COLLECTION

- **Collection Months:** Bulk trash will be collected in **March, April, July, September, and December**. Check the collection schedule for specific dates.
- **Size Limit:** Bulk trash will be collected in **March, April, July, September, and December**. Check the collection schedule for specific dates. The total amount of bulk trash cannot exceed **1.5 cubic yards** (which is 8 feet long, 2 feet wide, and 3 feet high). **If any bulk trash is not collected, you need to remove it yourself.**
- **Mattresses and Box Springs:** These must be covered with plastic bags and sealed. You can buy queen-size bags at City Hall for **\$10**.
- **Recyclables:** Appliances and metals must be separated from regular trash and will be collected after all other trash is picked up.
- **Items Not Collected:**
 - Cardboard & Newspapers
 - Items containing freon such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners
 - Propane tanks
- **Paint Cans:** Must be empty and dry with no lids.
- **Long Items:** Cut to **4 feet in length** and tie them.
- **Small Items:** Must be bagged, boxed, or canned.
- **Commercial Establishments:** There are no bulk trash collections for businesses.
- **Prohibited Items:**
 - Logs and stumps
 - Rocks, dirt, asphalt, or concrete
 - Large automobile parts
 - Household/toxic chemicals
 - Grass clippings
 - Any type of construction or renovation debris

COMMINGLE AND NEWSPAPER/CARDBOARD COLLECTION

Be sure to check your local calendar for pick-up schedules! If you have any questions or need more information, feel free to contact the DPW Office.

Commingle Guidelines:

- **Rinsing:** All containers must be rinsed before recycling.
- **Container Requirements:** Use marked containers, trash cans (up to 32 gallons), or clear/blue transparent bags.
- **Collection Timing:** All eligible items **must be placed curbside by 6:30 a.m.** on your scheduled collection day.

Non-Recyclable Materials will not be collected. These include:

- **Glass:** Crystal, window glass, mirrors, drinking glasses, and dinnerware.
- **Ceramics:** Ovenware and other ceramics.
- **Miscellaneous:** Light bulbs, broken glass, foam, vinyl, plastic bags and wrap, waxed cardboard dairy containers, flatware, caps, lids, oil/paint cans, batteries, appliances, coat hangers, aluminum siding, sheet and scrap metal.

Paper and Cardboard Recycling:

- **Acceptable Items:** Newspapers, phone books, magazines, brochures, catalogs, junk mail, tissue boxes, cereal boxes.
- **Bundling:** Place items in brown paper bags or tie into bundles with twine.
- **Cardboard:** Flatten and tie or place in another corrugated box (no tape or plastic bags).

COMPOSTING

You can turn food waste into rich topsoil right in your backyard through **composting**. This process speeds up the natural decay of organic matter by creating a good environment for bacteria and microorganisms.

The end product, called compost or humus, resembles fertile garden soil and provides essential nutrients for plants. You can **add materials like leaves, grass clippings, vegetable scraps, and coffee grounds** to your compost pile. Avoid adding diseased plants, meat scraps, or pet waste.

Composting can be **simple** or more involved, depending on how much waste you have and how quickly you want results. There are various methods including hot composting, cold composting, and vermicomposting (using worms). There are even indoor composting appliances. Composting benefits the City of Peekskill by **improving air quality, enhancing soil fertility, and reducing the need for store-bought soil and fertilizers**. By starting your compost pile now, you can **help the environment and save money** by spring!

FOOD SCRAP COLLECTION

How to Recycle Food Scraps:

1. Collect Your Scraps:

- Use a pail to collect food scraps.
- You can use a compostable bag to line your pail, but **no plastic bags**.
- It's best to keep the pail in your house or garage. You can also freeze scraps in a recyclable bag during the week.

2. Drop-Off Site:

- Take your pail to the Food Scrap Recycling drop-off site at the City of Peekskill Garage at **1003 Lower South St.**
- The site is open 24/7.
- There's no charge to drop off your food scraps.

3. What Happens to Your Scraps:

- All collected scraps are taken to a commercial composting facility where they are turned into compost.

Accepted Items:

○ Fruits and vegetables (remove stickers and ties)	○ Nuts and seeds (shells are okay)
○ Meat and poultry (bones are okay)	○ Leftover, spoiled, or expired food (cooked is okay)
○ Fish and shellfish (shells are okay)	○ Coffee grounds (paper filters are okay)
○ Dairy products	○ Tea bags (remove staples)
○ Bread and pasta	○ Paper towels, tissues, and napkins
○ Rice and grains	○ Wooden chopsticks, popsicle sticks, and corks
○ Egg shells	○ Cut flowers
○ Chips and snacks	○ Compostable bags (no plastic bags)

Do Not Include:

- Plastic bags, packaging, or wrappers. Use compostable or paper bags only.
- Baby wipes or hand wipes, as they are synthetic and contaminate compost.
- Pet waste

COMMINGLE *

(MIXED MATERIAL: GLASS, METAL & PLASTIC)

- **ANY PLASTICS** marked with the recycle symbols 1 – 7*
- **GLASS BOTTLES & JARS** and their plastic or metal caps or lids
- **ALUMINUM & STEEL CANS**
- **SMALL PLASTIC LIDS** They must be attached to the bottle or container. Otherwise, throw them out.
- **LARGE RIGID PLASTICS** such as pails & laundry baskets, with a 1–7 recycle symbol
- **AEROSOL CANS** and their plastic tops
- **ALUMINUM** foil, plates, pans, take-out food containers, empty and clean



- **PLASTIC TAKE-OUT FOOD CONTAINERS**
- **BRITA WATER FILTERS**
- **PLASTIC SIX-PACK RINGS**
- **SHAMPOO & CONDITIONER BOTTLES**
- **CHARCOAL LIGHTER FLUID CONTAINER** rinsed out, with the top off
- **PLASTIC PLATES, CUPS, BOWLS & UTENSILS** with a 1–7 recycle symbol **ONLY**
- **PLASTIC SPRAY BOTTLES & PUMPS** Although the pumps are not numbered, they may be recycled.

* DID YOU KNOW THAT THESE ITEMS GO IN YOUR COMMINGLE BIN? THEY DO!

- **CARDBOARD BEVERAGE CARTONS** such as milk, juice, soy, rice, & almond milks, broth, etc. go with the commingle recyclables. Rinse and flatten cartons. The caps can also be recycled, attached to the carton.
- Also **FROZEN FOOD BOXES**, including ice cream containers, only if waxed. Unwaxed can be placed with paper/cardboard. (These are placed with commingle instead of paper/cardboard in order to keep those materials dry.)


Our rivers, streams, and aquifers are vital to our daily lives, so let's protect them from TRASH and DEBRIS.

IMPORTANT TO KNOW!

- ✓ All commingle items must be emptied and rinsed clean.
- ✓ Do not put recyclables in plastic bags.
- ✓ Newspapers should be bundled & tied, or placed in paper bags. Place loose paper (mail, etc.) in paper bags.
- ✓ Small plastic lids should be attached to bottle.
- ✓ If heavy winds are forecast, either put your bin out shortly before curbside pickup, or have it securely covered, with a weight on top if necessary, to keep items from blowing away.




COLLECTION REGULATIONS

PAPER & CARDBOARD

- **NEWSPAPERS**, tied & bundled or placed in a cardboard box or paper bag
- **BOXES** such as cereal, pasta, crackers, six-pack cartons, etc. (plastic windows are OK)
- **CORRUGATED CARDBOARD** Remove packing material from cardboard boxes, collapse cardboard and place inside another box, or tie in bundles.
- **PAPER CUPS & PLATES**, unwaxed only, clean
- **EGG CARTONS**, cardboard only
- **MAIL**, including greeting cards, junk mail, & envelopes (plastic windows on envelopes are OK, but dispose of any enclosed plastic cards.)
- **Spiral & 3-Ring Binders**, metal binding removed first
- **TISSUE PAPER**, unused only
- **CIGARETTE PACKS**, inner foil removed
- **PAPER TOWEL & TOILET PAPER ROLLS**
- **POST-IT NOTES**
- **MAGAZINES**
- **PAPER TABLETS**
- **PAPERBACK BOOKS**
- **CATALOGS**
- **SHREDDED PAPER**

A word about **PIZZA BOXES** –
DO NOT throw the greasy portion of the pizza box in the recycle bin. Tear it off and discard it, and place the clean half of the box in the paper/cardboard bin. Otherwise, discard the entire box.



X THESE ITEMS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE

- **PLASTIC BAGS** including grocery, produce, dry cleaning & pet food bags
- **BATTERIES**
- **PLASTIC STRAWS**
- **PLASTIC UTENSILS** unless they have a 1-7 recycle symbol

- **STYROFOAM** including cups, egg cartons, take-out food containers, and packaging
- **PLASTIC WRAP** including Saran or other shrink wrap, paper towel packaging, etc.
- **JUICE POUCHES** such as Capri Sun
- **WINDOW OR MIRROR GLASS**
- **ELECTRONIC WASTE**
- **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS**
- **RECYCLE BINS** unless labeled 1–7
- **HARDBACK BOOKS**

Hazardous and hard-to-dispose-of waste can be brought to Westchester County's Household Materials Recovery Facility (H-MRF) located on the Grasslands Campus at 15 Woods Rd, Valhalla. The County periodically holds Household Recycling Days at FDR Park in Yorktown Heights, where you can bring most of these same materials. * PLEASE CONSIDER THESE * ALTERNATIVES TO DISPOSAL

- **PLASTIC BAGS**; Most supermarkets, CVS, Target, & some other stores have collection bins for plastic bags (including dry cleaner bags) & bubble wrap.
- **BATTERIES**; garages & car dealers should accept car batteries. Button cell batteries are accepted at Westchester County's Household Materials Recovery Facility and Household Recycling Day at FDR Park; also at Home Depot, Staples, and CVS. Regular household batteries (AAA, D, etc.) can be thrown away.
- **TEXTILES**; If in useable condition, fabric items can be donated to second-hand stores such Goodwill or Salvation Army. Otherwise, they're accepted at some animal shelters. Items can also be taken to either Westchester County's Household Materials Recovery Facility, or Greentree Textiles at the Ossining Farmers Market.
- **HARDBACK BOOKS** may be donated to the Field Library or Bruised Apple book stores (not all are accepted). Otherwise they can be disassembled and the pages recycled in paper/cardboard bin. The hard cover must be thrown out.
- **INKJET & TONER CARTRIDGES** are accepted at many of the stores where they are sold.
- **POLYSTYRENE PEANUTS & BUBBLE WRAP** are accepted at UPS Stores for recycling.

BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Place your trash and recyclables at the curb **in front of your property**. Do not put waste from homes or businesses in public bins at city parks or streets or in front of other storefronts or properties. Violators will face penalties.

- Garbage:** Collected Monday to Friday. Place it curbside between 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. There's also a collection every Saturday morning by 7 a.m.
- Cardboard and Paper:** Collected on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Place them curbside between 6 a.m. and 9 a.m.
- Commingle (Glass, Plastic, and Metal):** Collected on Friday, curbside between 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. (Check the calendar for holiday exceptions.)
- Bulk Trash:** Collected by appointment only. Call D.C.S. at 914-734-4130 to schedule. No construction debris will be picked up.
- Electronics:** TVs and computer monitors are not collected. You must take them to the City Services Garage on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

**There is a fixed fine of \$300 for any garbage pickup that exceeds the limit by up to double.
If the pickup exceeds double the limit, the fine increases to \$600.**

SATURDAY DROP OFF

To dispose of bulk trash and garbage at the City Garage on Saturdays, you need a punch card, which costs **\$36** and includes five punches. You can buy this card at the **Department of Public Works Office** at City Hall. At this time, **we only accept payments in cash or check**. The City Garage is open every Saturday from **9 a.m. to 12 noon** at **1003 Lower South Street** in Peekskill. This service is for residents only.

Drop-Off Rules:

The first bag of garbage and all recyclables are free to dispose of.

Recyclables include:

- **E-Waste:** Up to two pieces per weekend (e.g., TV, microwave, printers, computers).
- **Metal Appliances (without FREON):** Dishwashers, dryers, washing machines, stoves, water heaters, etc.
- **Cardboard & Newspaper:** Includes phone books, magazines, brochures, junk mail, tissue boxes, and cereal boxes. Items must be flattened and placed in boxes, bagged in brown paper bags, or bundled with twine.
- **Commingled Items:** Plastic containers (marked 1-7), glass bottles (with caps removed), aluminum and tin cans, empty aerosol cans.
- **Yard Waste:** Must be in biodegradable bags.

All other items require a Saturday Drop-Off Card or a **prepaid sticker**.

Allowed Trash Items with Drop-Off Card:

- Household garbage: The first bag is free; you can dispose of up to two cans or the equivalent.
- Furniture, file cabinets, desks, clothing, and other listed items (**maximum of two items per vehicle**).
- Pull Out Couches – Mattress must be removed, bagged in plastic and taped shut
- Mattress & Box Spring; must be bagged in plastic and taped shut
- Paint cans; dried completely of paint with lids removed
- Lawn mowers with no gas or oil.
- Swing sets, dismantled; cut down to 4ft, bundled and tied. No cement bottoms.
- Carpeting & padding; cut to 4ft long, rolled and tied or taped – limited to (5) rolls
- Any long items must be cut to 4ft in length and tied

Important Notes:

- Disposal of tires, empty propane tanks and items containing freon such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, etc. require a separate **pre-paid sticker**.
- Construction debris or materials from home renovations or improvements (including, but not limited to sheetrock, flooring, concrete, asphalt, roof shingles, toilets, sinks, kitchen cabinets etc.) will **NOT** be accepted.
- Only standard-size vehicles and small pickup trucks are allowed.

SATURDAY DROP OFF

DISPOSAL OF SPECIAL ITEMS

You may legally dispose of 20 lb. propane tanks, tires, appliances containing refrigerants, and request special garbage pickups under the following conditions.

To initiate the disposal process, please complete the form below and either mail it to the Office of the City Clerk or deliver it in person. Prepayment is required for the items listed. All fees for these special services must be approved by the Department of Public Works prior to prepayment. A receipt will be issued upon payment, which is required before the service is rendered.

Fees for Special Services (Section 485-11)

The following fees apply for specific services provided by the Department of City Services:

1. Item Removal:

- \$10.00 for garbage bag
- \$13.00 per 20 lb. propane tank or tire
- \$25.00 each per mattress
- \$35.00 for chipper service
- \$42.00 per refrigerator, freezer, or air conditioner (Note: Refrigerator and freezer doors must be removed.)
- \$45.00 for TVs up to 52 inches
- \$85.00 for TVs over 52 inches

2. Special Trash Pickup:

- \$70.00 minimum for items measuring up to 8 ft long x 3 ft high x 2 ft wide. Please contact DPW Office to schedule visit for pricing.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

USED MOTOR OIL

Bring used motor oil to the D.C.S. Maintenance Garage at 1003 Lower South Street Monday thru Friday from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. Limit 5 gals of oil. Please do not leave any items outside of the gate.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Christmas trees will be chipped on Thursdays during the months of January and February. Trees with nails, lights, metal wires or bags will not be chipped.

CELL PHONE RECYCLING

Cell phones contain highly toxic materials and need to be disposed of properly. As of June 2006, it is against the law to throw a cell phone in the garbage. Violators can be fined up to \$250. You may drop off unwanted cell phones at the City Services Garage, located at the intersection of Louisa Street and South Street, on Saturday mornings from 9 a.m. until noon.

HELPFUL TIPS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION


- When you purchase a new appliance, mattress, rug, furniture, TV, computer, etc., ask the dealer to remove your old item(s).

Sweeper Rules


Will be in effect April 1st thru December 1st (Weather Permitting)

Alternate side of the street parking will be in effect between 6 AM and 11 AM hours in designated areas. Please follow the instructions on the posted signs. Please remove vehicles from the streets on the scheduled days for street sweeping in all other areas.

Even calendar days are the 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th, etc. Odd calendar days are the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, etc.

Please remove any large items from the curb (rocks, bricks, sticks, milk jugs). Then, please follow the new parking regulations and move your vehicles for a Cleaner Peekskill.

Westchester County is currently Accepting Household Chemicals by appointment only. For instructions on items that are not acceptable and how to dispose of them, call the Westchester County Household Chemical Hotline at (914) 813-5425 or visit their website at www.westchestergov.com. Some accepted Items include: Most automotive fluids, flammable liquids, polishes, pesticides, and insecticides, swimming pool chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, compact fluorescent bulbs, Expired or unused pharmaceuticals, e-waste, propane tanks, batteries (car, alkaline, rechargeable, and button.)

IMPORTANT NOTICE –WESTCHESTER COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT RADILOGICAL MEDICATION RESIDUALS CAN NOT BE DISPOSED OF IN THE GARBAGE

If you or your pets are receiving medical treatment involving radioactive materials, all residuals or personal items that could collect body fluids should be returned to the hospital or health care facility where you or your pet received treatment, for proper disposal. Your doctor will advise you how long after treatment you will need to continue taking these precautions. These items include: Diapers, excreta, kitty litter, sanitary napkins, tampons, tissues, or other products used to absorb bodily fluids.

SHARPS DISPOSAL

Proper sharps disposal is important to the safety of the sharps user and workers who handle trash. Follow these guidelines to keep yourself and others safe. Use a leak-proof, shatterproof, and puncture-proof container with a screw top, such as a plastic laundry soap container labeled SHARPS. Place the lancet, needle, and syringe immediately and secure the screw top on the container. When the container is full, apply tape around the neck and top of the container. The preferred method of disposal is to take the full container to the SHARPS disposal site listed in the Westchester County brochure. Local sites listed are New York Presbyterian / Hudson Valley Hospital and 1980 Crompton Road. The alternate method is to place the container in with the household trash.

Never place SHARPS in with the recycling.

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

As property owners, you are responsible for removing snow and ice from the sidewalks in front of your property. Here are some key points from the City of Peekskill's Chapter 474 "Snow and Ice Removal."

Responsibilities:

- **Residential Properties:** You must clear sidewalks within **24 hours** after the snowfall ends.
- **Commercial Properties:** You must clear sidewalks within **4 hours** after the snowfall ends.

Placement of Snow:

- It is **illegal** to throw or place any snow or ice into streets, sidewalks, parks, or other public areas.

Enforcement:

- If you fail to remove snow or ice, the Director of Public Works may have it removed at your expense. You will be charged for the removal plus a **25% administrative fee**. If unpaid, this cost will be added to your property tax bill.

Penalties:

- Violating these rules is considered disorderly conduct and can result in fines:
 - **\$100** for a first offense
 - **\$250** for a second offense
 - **\$500** for a third offense

Alternate Side of the Street Parking:

According to Section 290-35 of the Peekskill Code, alternate side parking rules apply during winter (December 1st through April 1st)

Parking Schedule:

Even Number Side:

- 8 PM Tuesday to 8 AM Wednesday
- 8 PM Thursday to 8 AM Friday
- 8 PM Saturday to 8 AM Sunday
- 8 PM Sunday to 8 AM Monday

Odd Number Side:

- 8 PM Monday to 8 AM Tuesday
- 8 PM Wednesday to 8 AM Thursday
- 8 PM Friday to 8 AM Saturday

During these times, **you cannot park** on any street in Peekskill **between 8 PM and 8 AM**, except in areas designated for alternate side parking.
